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Solving problems caused by the pandemic with robotics


About

Inquiry-Based Learning teaching methodology was used.


How does it work? How can others also too?

The designs are made up of simple electronic circuits, use a few sensors and are easy to program. Electronic components are low cost and programming software is free. All you need is basic programming knowledge. Students created support reports.


PROTOTYPE 1 - Automatic hand sanitizing gel dispenser
